On this Day – January 5

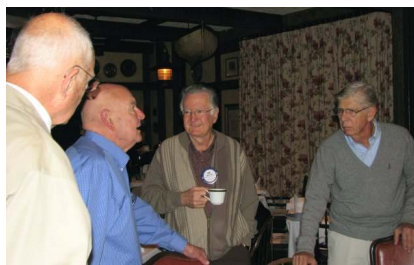
President Tim Brown enlightened us with the following milestones that occurred on January 5th:

Abuse of Prescription and Over-the-Counter Drugs

Ms Umipig showed us a quick video regarding the abuse of prescription and over-the-counter drugs in Newport Beach. Parents and caregivers are the first line of defense in addressing this troubling trend. The concerning trends are the abuse by adolescents between the ages of 12 and 13, teen females and young adults between 18 and 24. The drugs being abused are painkillers, depressants – such as sleeping pills or anti-anxiety drugs – and stimulants – such as those prescribed for attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) – and cough and cold remedies. Every day, 2,500 youths, age 12 to 17, abuse a pain reliever for the very first time. More teens abuse prescription drugs than any illicit drug except marijuana. In 2006, more than 2.1 million teens ages 12 to 17 reported abusing prescription drugs. Because these drugs are so readily available, teens who wouldn't otherwise touch illicit drugs might abuse prescription drugs. And not many parents are talking to them about it, even though teens report that parental disapproval is a powerful way to keep them away from drugs.

Here is what you as parents and grandparents can do: Safeguard all drugs at home. Monitor quantities and control access. Set clear rules for teens about all drug use, including not sharing medicine and always following the medical provider's advice and dosage. Be a good role model by following these same rules with your own medicines. Properly conceal and dispose of old or unused medicines in the trash. Ask friends and family to safeguard their prescription drugs a well. Talk to your teen about the dangers of abusing prescription and over-the-counter drugs.
