President Tim Brown enlightened us with the following milestones that occurred on September 15th:

**1616** – The first non-aristocratic, free public school in Europe is opened in Frascati, Italy.

**1835** – HMS Beagle, with Charles Darwin aboard, reaches the Galápagos Islands.

**1916** – World War I: Tanks are used for the first time in battle, at the Battle of the Somme.

**1947** – RCA releases the 12AX7 vacuum tube.

**1959** – Nikita Khrushchev becomes the first Soviet leader to visit the United States.

**1966** – U.S. President Lyndon B. Johnson, responding to a sniper attack at the University of Texas at Austin, writes a letter to Congress urging the enactment of gun control legislation.

**1981** – The Senate Judiciary Committee unanimously approves Sandra Day O'Connor to become the first female justice of the Supreme Court of the United States

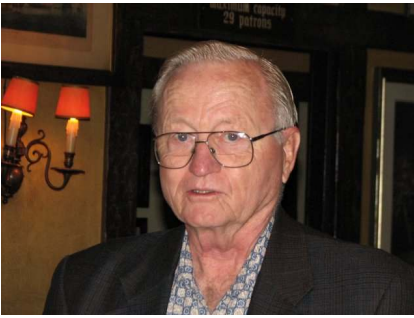
#### Taste of Newport

## Safari of Hope

President Tim Brown introduced Kimberly McKinney, our speaker today. Kimberly stated that Father Henry Simaro was invited to attend a fundraiser for his school at Notre Dame so he could not be with us today. Kimberly showed us pictures of the raising of the Mt. Olive Academy from ground breaking to the completed first 2-story building. The school is scheduled to open in January 2010. The land for the school was donated and is completely fenced. Some machinery is used but most of the work was done by hand with picks. The stone blocks for the fence were hand made. There are 16 classrooms. There is a large garden, which will sustain the school. The pictures of several young girls modeling their new uniforms are just too cute. Local day students will help support the students who live at the school. Women are the key to ending hunger in Africa. \$323,000 was raised last year for the school and it is debt free to date. Rotary has raised the money for the furniture. The African Child fund controls the money. The Newport Irvine and Newport Balboa Rotary Clubs have joined us in the grant. The pictures of the progress had many pictures with Sylvia Michler, Kimberly McKinney and Pat Beckman, a guest at today's meeting.
