Tom Egan is taking members' pictures for posting in the online directory. Cal will insert them in the directory. Every member should have received his individual password number. If you did not,

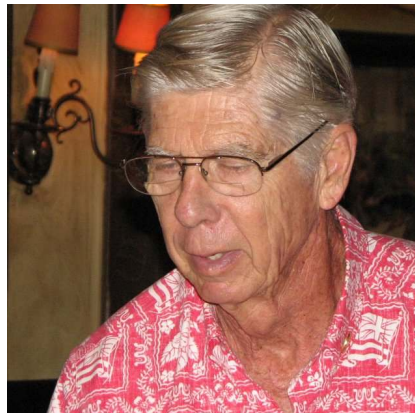

Last Wednesday evening Lynne Hayes attended the annual twilight picnic dinner at the Environmental Nature Center with Caroline Babott as her guest. The ENC honored a former chairman of the board of directors who had served a total of 17 years during three terms, and a long time volunteer who had recently died.

Sunday 10/18/09 from 10:00 to 3:00 -- great for families with children and grandchildren.

Lynne recently became a member of the Newport Harbor Nautical Museum. Last Thursday evening she attended one of the Waterman Lecture Series at the museum. Orrin Pilkey, a James B. Duke Professor of Geology Emeritus at Duke University and a great speaker, talked about the rising oceans and the consequences for fish, wildlife and people. On 10/22/09 Ray Hiemstra, the Associate Director of Orange County Coast keeper, with talk about marine protected areas in Orange County, and on 11/12/09 Craig B. Smith, an electrical engineer, will talk about the physics of lightning strikes and the effects of electricity on the body and lightning on property.

The lectures are from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. and are free to members of the Newport Harbor Nautical Museum, \$10 for non-members, and \$5 for students.
