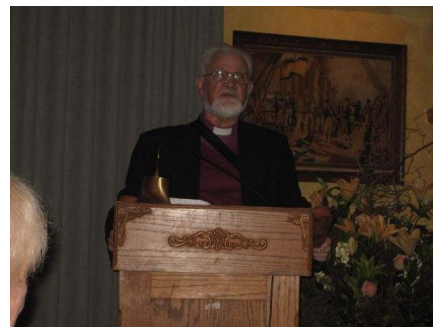

[Alan Kenyon-Hoart, Bishop of the Diocese of Southern Africa for the Anglican Catholic Church](#)

Willis Longyear introduced Alan Kenyon-Hoart, Bishop of the

Diocese of Southern Africa for the Anglican Catholic Church. Bishop Alan told us he is a Brit who has lived in South Africa for 50 years and is too familiar with the social and political scene. As a young man he finished his military service in the UK and went to Africa as a Colonial Police. Upon returning the England he met his wife who was from South Africa so they returned to her home.

He lived under Apartheid from 1961 to 1994 when there was work and food for all. There was no crime and now it is so dangerous because of unemployment. Now there is 65% unemployment (politicians will say it is only 25%). The government corruption is the absolute worst. Bishop Alan believes there is no excuse for crime, no matter what the reason. In South Africa the word "colored" means a person who is half black and half white. He told us about Father Mike and how he delivers food to the most dangerous areas in Cape Town so people won't starve. He spoke of an orphanage with 27 children. Because there are no birth certificates for 23 of these children they get government grants for only 4. This orphanage recently burned to the ground so the children have been farmed out to various families. They are working on raising money to build a new building and the government has

given them some land. He also told us about an eye clinic where a doctor saw 300 patients in 2 days and provided free glasses for all of them. One woman saw her children for the first time. Opportunities for outsiders in South Africa are there and China sees it. They have a multitude of resources but because of the corruption and danger there is no future. Any funds donated to help the people is stolen by those in power. He invites you to visit Cape Town and he will share a bottle or two of wine with you. He left us with these words: "there is no hope but God for South Africa".
