### Today's Speaker

Our speaker today was Michael L. Riley Ph.D. M.Ed., Chief Deputy Director, Orange County Social Services Agency. The Agency is comprised of four divisions: Adult Services and Assistance Programs; Children and Family Services; Family Self-Sufficiency and Administrative Services. His discussion today was primarily about the Children and Family Services Division.

Child abuse is prevalent in society. The primary causes in child welfare families are domestic violence, substance abuse, mental illness, and poverty.

The Children and Family Services Division's role is to provide services to families and children for the protection of children endangered by abuse, neglect or exploitation. The Child Abuse Registry receives over 41,000 reports of suspected child abuse annually. On average 34 children are placed monthly with adoptive parents in Orange County and 3,045 children are in out-of-home care receiving family reunification or permanent placement services

monthly, approximately 49% reside in homes with relatives, 42% reside in County foster homes, and 9% in group homes.

The focus of the agency's programs is to divert children from congregate care; reduce the number of placements and duration; and safely reunify children and their families in a timely manner.
