**African Child Foundation Mt. Olive Academy, Kenya Kimberly McKinney**

Club member Kimberly McKinney conducted the program today. The original speaker Fr. Henry Simano was delayed by visa problems on his trip from Kenya.

African Child Foundation has been a Newport Sunrise supported charity for the past four years. During this time desks, blankets and bunk beds have been purchased with the donations from Rotary. Girls in the Athi River slum area are particularly vulnerable because most are orphans and are taking care of their siblings. Without the opportunity to go to school the girls would be married at 13 or sold into prostitution in Molongo, a trucker town near our schools. The young girls can go to school with a meal, water, uniform and education and their baby siblings also will get food, water a uniform at our baby schools. Last year Newport Beach Sunrise, Fullerton and Hurlingham joined together in a matching grant for 18 computers and monitors. The computers were installed in May, when African Child Foundation board members and their son's helped Hurlingham Rotary with delivery of computers to Mt. Olive. Computer training is a required subject in Kenya for middle school children. Computers for Kenya

gave Fr. Henry used computers in 2010, but most did not work they were so old. Hurlingham's President volunteered to service the old computers and will continue help as needed. African Child Foundation goal this year is to sponsor 100 children. African Children Foundation has raised over 1.2 million in the last five years. Sponsorship's per year: \$360 elementary, \$720 middle, and \$1,200 High school. This years fundraiser entitled "Safari of Hope" will be held at the home of Michele Ayers, tickets are \$95.00 and available at the door.

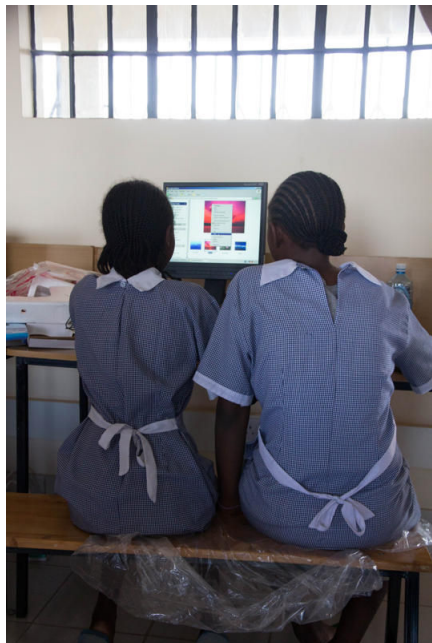
