

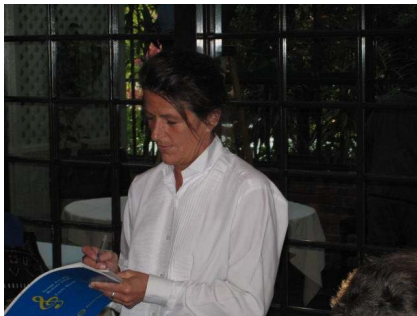

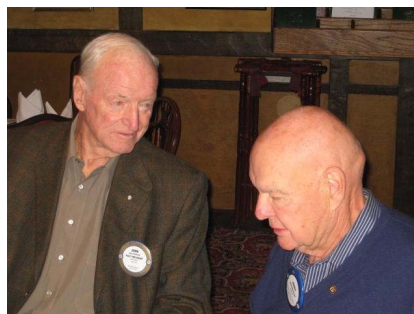

Rotary's \$200 Million Challenge

Cynthia Cowell introduced Past District Governor Roger McGonagle here today to speak to us about the Rotary Foundation. Roger announced that our Club was one of five to be recognized at the rent Rotary Foundation Dinner for being a 100% Paul Harris Sustaining Club. He congratulated us because only 569 Clubs in the world achieved this goal. He informed us that the Polio projected started in 1980 in the Philippines. Rotary made the historic decision to immunize all the world children against polio. A little more than 20 years later, the world is nearly polio free. Rotary has partnered with the World Health Organization, UNICEF, and the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and now with funds donated with the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation it could happen in our lifetime. The greatest challenge in the battle against polio today is financial. Despite the enormous resources already committed, more money is urgently needed. Rotary is committed to raising \$200 Million by June 30, 2012. This is a realistic and manageable goal with your help.
