Reniero Francisco introduced Monica Venable, a health educator for National Council on Alcoholism and Drug Dependence – Orange County/Community Alliance Network. She is a graduate of CA State Fullerton. She currently is working with community members, youth, law enforcement and retailers to educate and prevent underage drinking in Newport Beach as well as Dana Point, Laguna Beach and Anaheim Hills. Her role as a health educator is to also promote and support the continuance of health lifestyles away from alcohol, tobacco and other drugs. As a certified TIPS trainer she also organizes Responsible Beverage Service training for merchants to be given during the holidays.

NCADD-OC/CAN is dedicated to using innovative prevention strategies that reduce harms

associated with the use of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs. In the Newport Mesa School District 33% of 9th graders and 52% of 11th graders drink. Newport Beach is higher than the rest of the County and actually the highest in the US. Many energy drinks have alcohol but it difficult to find the warning on the cans.
