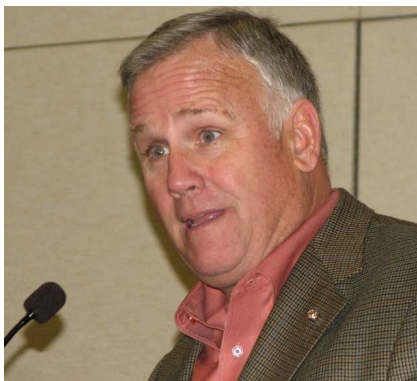

Cynthia Cowell introduced Dave Kiff, Newport Beach City Manager for the past 2 months,

Mr. Kiff has been with the City of Newport Beach for the past 12 years as Assistant City Manager. He gave us a brief report on the following:

Civic Center Project (new City Hall) which will be 89,000 sq feet with 34 parking spaces, a park, a dog park, and expansion of the library at a cost of \$105 Million.

John Wayne Airport size and curfew. He stated that the City is working with the County on the agreement.

Dredging of Upper Bay, which is a \$45 Million dollar project supported by federal Stimulus funds.

Lower Bay will start dredging and they are working on getting federal money for this project.

New Police Chief.

Of interest were the questions and comments posed by the members and guests, which Mr. Kiff was asked to answer or comment on:

Santa Ana County Club wants to become a part of Newport Beach but approval is needed from Costa Mesa.

Plans for existing City Hall – no plans as yet.

What is being done about the problems with the development approval process?

Number of flights out of John Wayne Airport – cap on the loudest flights.

7 members on the City Council are paid a stipend per month of \$800 and receive no pension

Sober living homes – what does he foresee or plan for these homes?

Marina Park – County decided to close and is currently renting back to the tenants but it will become a park.

Fiscal soundness of the City and of its pension programs.

Police Chief and promotional process.

A book will be donated to the Newport Beach Library in the name of Dave Kiff.
