Water Issues in Newport Beach Quality/Run Off/Rates

Bill Robbins introduced Tom Ash, Director of Conservation Alliances, and Business Development at Weather TRAK.

Mr. Ash confirmed that water rates are rising as much as 30% in certain cities and more public education is needed. The “Smart Box” which he explained how it worked. **Looking Outside.** In their search for answers to our water crisis, sustainability leaders are looking outside. 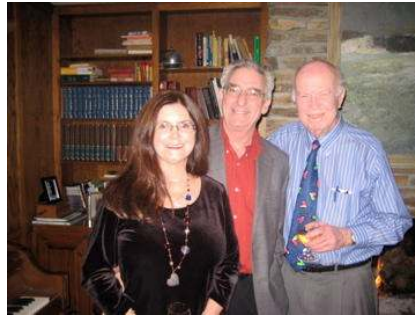
