Drug Court

Patricia Bintliff introduced Judge Matt Anderson of the Orange County Drug Court who presented today's program, Judge Anderson has been associated with Drug Courts in both Aliso Viejo and Newport Beach. He was originally appointed to the bench by Governor Pete Wilson and has been in the Drug Courts for 13 years.

Drug Courts bring together a group of resources including Probation Officers, Health Care, Sheriff, Police, District Attorney, Social Workers and the Judge. They all work together to determine the best treatment plan to follow for an individual under the jurisdiction of the Drug Court. Drug folks are like the rest of us but are suffering from a disease. The purpose is to reduce the numbers of individuals going to prison, encourage treatment and turn out a person that can contribute to society. To be assigned to the Drug Court an individual must be arrested, not a drug seller, and have an evaluation to determine the individual is a likely candidate. Once selected the individual receives a stay of his or her sentence and an invitation to join the program. All ages have been in program.

The minimum term is eighteen months and the average length in the program is twenty seven months. To graduate from the program the person should be employed, have a high school diploma and be released from a residential treatment home. The program has various sanctions to encourage compliance with the treatment plan including the threat of returning the individual to jail.

The program is funded by both Federal, State and County

governments. The program has had many successes. About 25% of individuals in the program end up being rearrested compared to 76% on those not in the program. Studies show that for every \$1.00 spent, \$7.80 is saved incarceration expenses. The Drug Court model is now being followed in other situations including DUI, Mental Health and Veterans.

To be successful a Drug Court needs to have private sector involvement. Several organizations contribute in a variety of different ways.
