Her father, a LA Police Officer, taught her about service to others, and her mother taught her about the importance of education. She is a graduate of Cal State Long Beach and received her Masters from the University of Colorado. She interned for 1 year as a physical therapist with the Ducks

but learned that sports therapy was not for her so she went into physical therapy with young adults with traumatic brain injuries. This taught her not to sweat the small stuff. Her next leap was into patient care and hospice. Her sister died alone in a hospital and this motivated her to educate others on the benefits of hospice. From there she was recruited by Silverado Senior Living to work with Alzheimer patients and with memory patients.

Steve grew up in an environmental family. Steve moved to a house on the Back Bay almost two decades ago and has been involved in many different environmental organizations. He is the owner of Newport Homes in Corona del Mar. He recently swam from Alcatraz Island to San Francisco and raised \$6,000 to benefit AIDS orphans. He came in 6th out of 40.

Steve is currently on the Advisory Board at University of California Irvine for their Sustainability Leadership program and a founding member and President of the OC Green Chamber. Steve founded the Green Buyers Broker

Organization, which helps homeowners install solar panels and green products for their homes. Steve also sits on the board for Orangewood PALs and the Bacchus Doc in a Box. This group is working with a local High School to design and build a mobile medical center to ship to South Africa in 2011. Steve is the past president for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society and a volunteer for the American Cancer Society. Steve joined the NBC Board in 2009 as co-chair of the Donor and Community Relations Committee. He chaired the Rebranding Committee in 2010 resulting in the name change to Newport Bay Conservancy, of which he is President. His priorities for the Bay are education and restoration.

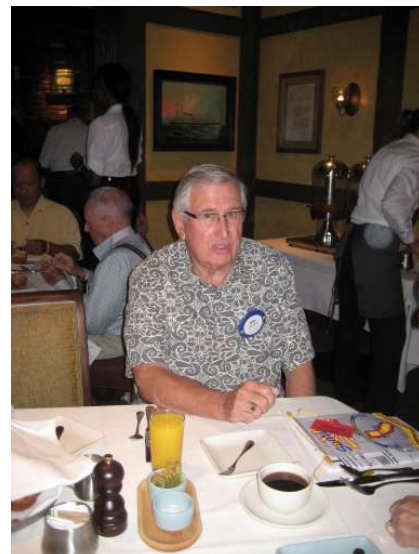
