Craft Talk Frank Oliveres

Bill Gibson, Club Blue Badge Coordinator, introduced new member Frank Olivares, to tell us about his 30 years as a jockey and his life after being a jockey. Frank was born in El Paso, Texas and moved with his family to California at the age of three. He had many jobs as a youth including at eight years old is involved in midget auto racing, delivering flyers for a real estate agent, keeping bowling scores and working on automobiles with his father.

At seventeen he was introduced to the famous jockey Johnnie Longden at the Santa Anita track. Longden agreed to teach him about horses and horse racing. He spent the next five years learning all about horse racing including caring, exercising and learning to ride. These skills included learning to ride thoroughbreds, how to control speed, and breaking out of the gate.

After three years he got to ride in his first race at Hollywood Park as an apprentice. You are an apprentice for one year or 40 wins. His first win was at Bay Meadows track in Northern California. In his thirty year career he has ridden 60,000 horses, been in 30,000 races and had 3,000 winners. Most of his career was spent in Southern California were he says it is a good place to be a jockey

His biggest win was in the Florida Derby. He has also ridden in the Kentucky Derby and was been awarded the George Wolf Memorial Award.

After retirement he has become the Corporate Sales Director for Crevier BMW in Santa Ana.

He and his wife Jennifer have six children and live in Irvine.
