Candidate Dolores Otting



Dolores Otting

Tim Brown introduced Dolores Otting who is running for City Council representing District 7. Dolores is a 20 year Resident of Newport Beach, the City and she has thoroughly enjoyed being an integral part of our Community as a local Schoolteacher, Businesswoman, Vice-Chair of EQAC, Environmental Quality Affairs Committee, former Daily Pilot Watch Columnist, Real Estate Licensee, Community Advocate. Her Campaign is based on "Back to Basic" premise, which she believes has gotten lost with our current City government. Simply put, and feels we need transparency in our government. Our Public Money needs to be spent in **public**, and our Public Business needs to be conducted in **public**. Today, more than ever, the words of Abraham Lincoln at the Gettysburg Address on November 19, 1863 never rang truer: "...that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom — and that government **of** the people, **by** the people, **for** the people, shall not perish from the earth." Dolores stated that our 2006 Budget was \$192 Million. Our 2008 Budget is \$239 Million dollars and we are borrowing \$30 Million dollars to meet this year's budget obligations. Does it make sense to you? As your Councilperson,

she promises to represent **you**, the Residents of Newport Beach. She promises she will make it her job to ensure that you are listened to, and that people like you and me have a place in our government without the aid of a lobbyist or an attorney.

Candidate Steve Rosansky

Next Tim Brown introduced Council Member Steve Rosansky who is running for reelection in District 2. Mr. Rosansky moved to Balboa Island in 1985 after graduating from the Wharton School of Business and the UCLA School of Law. He and his family currently live in Newport Shores.

He began his service with the City as a Parks, Beaches & Recreation Commissioner in 2003 and was appointed to the City Council in 2003. In 2004 he won a four-year term in the general election and served a term as Mayor. He helped negotiate an agreement with the County of Orange to give the City of Newport Beach a veto authority over any proposed physical expansion of John Wayne Airport. He organized a successful effort to convince Cal Trans to sell to the City of Newport Beach a 15-acre parcel of land at Superior and Pacific Coast Highway for \$5,000,000 to be developed as an active sports park. He organized a conference in March 2007 to share ideas on the group home issue facing cities across California. The conference attendees represented over 100 local, county and state agencies from Chula Vista to Eureka. He helped develop a plan to construct medians in the center of Superior Avenue as part of a beautification and safety project and oversaw its successful implementation. At the request of residents, he implemented a

long-range plan to install traffic calming improvements in Newport Heights. Of course this is only a partial list of his accomplishments.
